

BIOGRAPHIES DR. JULEE KIM WALKER



A native Texan, flutist **Julee Kim Walker** remains an active performer and pedagogue in the Dallas-Ft. Worth metroplex. She is Associate Professor of Flute at Texas A&M University-Commerce. Prior to her appointment, she held teaching positions at Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Grayson College, Eastfield College, and the University of North Texas. She received her B.M. from the University of Texas at Austin and M.M. from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and the Doctorate of Musical Arts degree from the University of North Texas. She is the Artistic Director of the Texas Summer Flute Symposium, Vice President of the Texas Flute Society, and serves on the Executive Board of Directors in the National Flute Association as Secretary.

An esteemed teacher, Dr. Walker was the 2016 and 2020 recipient of the Paul W. Barrus Distinguished Faculty Award for Teaching at A&M-Commerce, and is widely sought-after as a clinician, adjudicator, masterclass teacher, and performer. She has appeared as guest artist all over the U.S, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, China and Italy. Her students have gone on to prestigious graduate degree programs and have successful careers as music educators throughout the state of Texas.

She performs regularly with FlutAria! trio, and has performed with Dallas Theater Center, New Orchestra of Washington, The Dallas Opera, The Dallas Winds, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, Fort Worth Opera, Abilene Philharmonic, Lyric Stage, among several others. Her primary teachers include Karl Kraber, Tim Day and Terri Sundberg.

DAVID BUCK



David Buck was appointed Principal Flute of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra in 2017. Praised for his "supple tone, rhythmic dynamism and technical agility" (The Oregonian), he was previously Principal Flute of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and has also held positions with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the Oregon Symphony. Guest principal appearances include the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra and the Baltimore Symphony.

As a soloist, Mr. Buck has collaborated with conductors including Fabio Luisi, Jaap van Zweden, Leonard Slatkin, John Storgårds, Richard Egarr, Paul Watkins and H. Robert Reynolds. In 2014, he recorded John Williams' rarely heard Concerto for Flute and Orchestra with Leonard Slatkin and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra for Naxos Records.

During the summer, Mr. Buck has appeared at the Great Lakes Chamber Music Festival, Oregon Bach Festival, Colorado Music Festival, Spoleto Festival del Due Monde, Tanglewood, Kent/Blossom, and the Pacific Music Festival. An avid chamber musician, he has performed with the Detroit Chamber Winds & Strings, the LA Phil New Music Group, and with members of the Guarneri and Emerson String Quartets.

A native of Philadelphia, David Buck began playing the flute at the age of nine. After initial studies with David Cramer, he graduated from The Juilliard School with a Bachelor of Music and Graduate Diploma as a student of Robert Langevin and Jeffrey Khaner. He lives in Dallas with his wife, flutist Jung-Wan Kang.

BRANDON PATRICK GEORGE

Brandon Patrick George is a leading flute soloist and Grammy®-nominated chamber musician whose repertoire extends from the Baroque era to today. He is the flutist of Imani Winds and has appeared as a soloist with the Atlanta, Baltimore, and Albany symphonies, American Composers Orchestra, and the Orchestra of St. Luke's, among others. He has been praised as "elegant" by The New York Times, as a "virtuoso" by The Washington Post, and as a "knockout musician with a gorgeous sound" by The Philadelphia Inquirer. His debut album was released by Haenssler Classics in September 2020; The New York Times has described it



as "a program that showcases the flute in all its wit, warmth and brilliance."

Brandon has performed at the Elbphilharmonie, the Kennedy Center, the Dresden Music Festival, and the Prague Spring Festival. In addition to his work with Imani Winds, Brandon's solo performances include appearances at Lincoln Center, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, 92nd Street Y, Tippet Rise, and Maverick Concerts. His current collaborations include touring projects with harpsichordist Mahan Esfahani, pianist Aaron Diehl, and harpist Parker Ramsay. In 2021, Brandon was part of the inaugural class of WQXR's Artist Propulsion Lab, a program designed to advance the careers of early and mid-career artists and support the future of classical music. During his yearlong residency at WQXR, Brandon guest hosted Evening Music, interviewed Ford Foundation president Darren Walker about diversity and equity in the performing arts, and recorded with pianist Aaron Diehl and harpist June Han. Prior to his solo career, Brandon performed as a quest with many of the world's leading ensembles including the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, the Orpheus Chamber Orchestra, and the International Contemporary Ensemble (ICE). With the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Brandon performed at Walt Disney Concert Hall and at the Hollywood Bowl with Music Director Gustavo Dudamel. His ensemble work allowed him to work closely with some of the foremost composers of our time including John Adams, Louis Andriessen, Tania León, Steve Reich, and George Lewis.

Raised by a single mother in Dayton, OH, Brandon is the proud product of public arts education. He draws on his personal experiences in his commitment to educating the next generation, performing countless outreach concerts for school children every year, and mentoring young conservatory musicians of color embarking on performance careers. Brandon trained at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, the Conservatoire de Paris, and the Manhattan School of Music. He serves on the faculty of the Curtis Institute and the Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity.

JAMES HALL



Flutist **James Hall** has enjoyed a varied and impressive career as an international soloist, chamber and orchestral musician, and teacher. He has performed with Joshua Roman, Eileen Eivers, Jennifer Koh, Paquito D'Rivera, Benny Kim, Carol Wincenc, Allan Vogel, Robert Weirich, Jim Walker, Art Garfunkel, Pink Martini, Carter Enyeart, Catalyst Quartet, and the Boulder Bach Festival, just to name a few.

As a concerto soloist, James has played with the Orquesta Nacional del Paraguay, Kansas City Civic Orchestra, Greeley Philharmonic, Orquesta Nacional de Panamá, Orquesta del Congresso Nacional del Paraguay, and the Southeast Kansas Symphony. After giving his Carnegie Hall debut recital as a winner of Artists International in 2004, James began to receive invitations to perform as a recitalist, and has since played across North, Central, and South America, Africa, Europe, and Asia. He is half of Colorado based duo970 with pianist Susie Maddocks, and the two tour the world performing flute and piano works from the baroque to the contemporary. In 2021, the duo commissioned works by American composers Stephanie Ann Boyd and Paul Elwood, and gave the world premieres of these works in Paris.

James is in high demand as a chamber musician, having been invited to play with musicians around the world. He is founder and artistic director for The Chattanooga Sound Project, and is the flutist for established ensembles including Chimera, Last Train, and Wood&Metal. He has also performed and taught at music festivals in the U.S. and in Central and South America. James has been invited to perform as a guest principal flutist with the Boulder Philharmonic, Greeley Philharmonic, Kansas City Chamber Orchestra, and Southeast Kansas Symphony, and has held principal flute positions with the Topeka Symphony and the Missouri Symphony.

As an educator, Hall has been invited to give master classes at national conservatories and music schools throughout the United States, Canada, Brazil, Argentina, Uruguay, Paraguay, South Africa, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Thailand, and Switzerland. Since 2009, he has been the professor of flute at the University of Northern Colorado where he has had the great fortune to work with many talented young musicians. James is a performing artist for Burkart Flutes and performs exclusively on his handmade 10k gold Burkart Elite flute with platinum head joint.

CONOR NELSON

Praised for his "long-breathed phrases and luscious tone" by the Minneapolis Star Tribune, Canadian flutist **Conor Nelson** is established as a leading flutist and pedagogue of his generation. Since his New York recital debut at Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall, he has frequently appeared as soloist and recitalist throughout the United States and abroad.

Solo engagements include concerti with the Minnesota Orchestra, the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, the Flint Symphony, and numerous other orchestras. In addition to being the only wind player to win the Grand Prize at the WAMSO Young



With percussionist Ayano Kataoka he performed at Merkin Concert Hall, Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Hall, and Izumi Hall. A recital at the Tokyo Opera City Hall that received numerous broadcasts on NHK Television. Their CD entitled, Breaking Training was released on New Focus Recordings (NYC). His second CD, Nataraja with pianist Thomas Rosenkranz is also available on New Focus. He has collaborated with Claude Frank on the Schneider concert series in NYC and appeared at numerous chamber music festivals across the country including the OK Mozart, Bennington, Skaneateles, Yellow Barn, Cooperstown, Salt Bay, Look and Listen (NYC), Norfolk (Yale), Green Mountain, Chesapeake, and the Chamber Music Quad Cities series.

He is the Principal Flutist of the New Orchestra of Washington in Washington, D.C., and has performed with the Detroit, Toledo, and Tulsa Symphony Orchestras. He also performed as guest principal with A Far Cry, Orquesta Filarmónica deJalisco, and the Conceirtos de la Villa de Santo Domingo.

A respected pedagogue, Dr. Nelson has given master classes at over one hundred colleges, universities, and conservatories. Prior to his appointment at UW-Madison, he served as the flute professor at Bowling Green State University for nine years and as the Assistant Professor of Flute at Oklahoma State University from 2007-2011. His recent residencies include Yonsei University in Seoul, Korea, the Sichuan Conservatory in Chengdu, China, the Conservatoriode Música de Puerto Rico, and the Associação Brasileira de Flautistas in São Paulo.

He is also a regular guest of the Texas Summer Flute Symposium and has been the featured guest artist for eleven flute associations across the country.

His former students can be found performing in orchestras, as well as teaching at colleges, universities, and public schools nationwide. They have also amassed over sixty prizes in young artist competitions, concerto competitions, and flute association competitions.

He received degrees from the Manhattan School of Music, Yale University, and Stony Brook University where he was the winner of the schoolwide concerto competitions at all three institutions. He is also a recipient of the Thomas Nyfenger Prize, the Samuel Baron Prize, and the Presser Award. His principal teachers include Carol Wincenc, Ransom Wilson, Linda Chesis, Susan Hoeppner, and Amy Hamilton. Conor is a Powell Flutes artist and is the Associate Professor of Flute at UW-Madison where he performs with the Wingra Wind Quintet.

GABRIEL SANCHEZ



Gabriel Sánchez is on the keyboard staff of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra under Fabio Luisi and has collaborated with principal DSO musicians, including Concertmasters, Alexander Kerr and Nathan Olson.

Sánchez was a top prize winner in the 1997 Casablanca International Piano Competition in Morocco and is a laureate of other international competitions, including the Marguerite Long in Paris (France), he Gina Bachauer in Salt Lake City (USA), and the Paloma O' Shea in Santander (Spain). He has performed throughout the United States and internationally in recital and as a soloist with orchestra, including performances at Pianofest in the Hamptons, New

York, with the Dallas Symphony under Kerry-Lynn Wilson and the Orquesta Filarmonica de Jalisco and the Irving Symphony under Hector Guzman.

Robert Carlos Contreras Roman, Mexican music critic, wrote that Sanchez performed with "gran passion y expresividad estilistica." In London, he performed at the Royal Academy of Music, in Paris at the Salle Gaveau, in Santander, Spain at the Palacio de Festivales, in Casablanca, Morocco at the Salle de l'Office des Changes, and in the Dominican Republic with the Orquesta Sinfonica Nacional. In Thessaloniki, Greece, he performed a solo recital to benefit Lions Club International.

He studied at London's Royal Academy of Music under a full scholarship and continued his studies at the University of North Texas under his beloved teacher and mentor, Vladimir Viardo, 1973 Van Cliburn Gold Medalist.

Sánchez is in high demand as a collaborative pianist and has partnered in recitals with Stanislav Katenin (principal bassoon, National Philharmonic of Russia), Gordon Hunt (principal oboe, Philharmonia Orchestra, London), Jacques Zoon (former Principal Flute, Concertgebouw Orchestra, Amsterdam), Mark Nuccio (Associate Principal Clarinet, New York Philharmonic) and Paul Edmond Davies (former Principal Flute, London Symphony Orchestra), as well as world renowned artists Gary Schocker, Alexa Still, Marco Granados, Thomas Robertello, Rolf Smedvig, Ian Clarke, Mike Mower and Jean Ferrandis.

MSR CD releases, all received with critical acclaim, include Ballade, Works for Flute and Piano (with Kara Kirkendoll Welch, flutist), Scree (with Elena Yarritu, flutist) and Rêver en Couleurs (with Lisa Garner Santa, flutist). Recent reviews include: Scott Cantrell, Dallas Morning News, "Sánchez dispatched [the Nielsen Flute Concerto piano reduction] with such èlan that it sounded utterly idiomatic," Carla Rees, Music Web International, "[he] plays with wonderful sensitivity," and American Record Guide, "...Sánchez is superb."

Mr. Sánchez is also a dedicated educator. He taught piano, music history, music theory and accompanying at the celebrated Booker T. Washington High School for the Arts in Dallas from 1996-2003. He maintains a select private piano studio and has been involved with DSO educational outreach programs. He has also served on the faculty of the Conservatory of Music in the Mountains in Durango, Colorado.

JESSICA SCHAUMBERG

Jessica Schaumberg is an Asian American flutist, teacher, and composer. She received a B.M. in Flute Performance and Composition from Western Illinois University, and is currently a Graduate Teaching Assistant at Texas A&M University-Commerce, where she is pursuing a Master of Music degree in Flute Performance.

She participated in the 2019 recording of David Maslanka's Symphony No. 10: The River of Time for Naxos Records under the baton of Mike Fansler. Her composition teachers include James Romig and Hong-Da Chin, and her original piece Undulations for solo cello was recently performed at the WIU 2022 New Music Festival. She currently runs a private studio in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. Her flute teachers include Suyeon Ko, Mehrdad Gholami, and Julee Kim Walker.
