A native Houstonian, Artistic Director **Julee Kim Walker** remains an active performer and pedagogue in the Dallas-Ft. Worth metroplex. She is Associate Professor of Flute at Texas A&M University-Commerce. Prior to her appointment, she held teaching positions at Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Grayson College, Eastfield College, and the University of North Texas. She received her Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Texas at Austin and her Master's degree from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. She received the Doctorate of Musical Arts degree from the University of North Texas. She is Artistic Director of the annual Texas Summer Flute Symposium.

As a soloist, she has performed with the Dallas Asian Wind Ensemble, American Wind Symphony Orchestra, Southeastern Symphonic Winds, Texas A&M University-Commerce Wind Ensemble and Banda Sinfônica de Cubatão in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Julee has also performed with notable flutists such as Ian Clarke, Valerie Coleman, Christina Jennings, Amy Porter and Carol Wincenc.

Performance highlights include a Texas tour with the Texas Guitar Quartet, performance at the World Saxophone Congress in Zagreb, Croatia, and recitals and masterclasses in Shanghai, China, Talca, Chile, and Buenos Aires, Argentina. Overseas, she was flutist for the Austrian American Mozart Academy Opera Festival in Salzburg, Austria for 4 seasons,



An esteemed teacher, Dr. Walker was the 2016 and 2020 recipient of the Paul W. Barrus Distinguished Faculty Award for Teaching, and is sought-after as a clinician, adjudicator, and for masterclasses and lectures all over the world, including University of North Texas, CU Boulder, Florida State University, Shanghai Normal University in China, and the Guri Project in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

Dr. Walker has adjudicated for the UIL Texas State Solo and Ensemble Competition, Sigma Alpha Iota Triennial, the Mid-South Flute Society, Houston Flute Club, Oklahoma Flute Society, TMTA and MTNA competitions, the Texas Flute Society's Myrna Brown Competition and the National Flute Association's Professional Flute Choir and Newly Published Music competitions. Dr. Walker currently serves as the Past President of the Texas Flute Society, and serves on the NFA Executive Board of Directors as Assistant Secretary.

Julee performs regularly with FlutAria! trio, The Dallas Winds, Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, Lyric Stage and Abilene Philharmonic. She has also performed with The Dallas Opera, Fort Worth Opera, Dallas Chamber Symphony, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, South Arkansas Symphony, Shreveport Symphony, Amarillo Symphony and Sherman Symphony. Her principal teachers include Terri Sundberg, Tim Day, Karl Kraber, Christina Jennings and September Payne.

With five albums to her credit, Kim Scott has proven to be a mainstay in the field and promise for the future as both a soloist and collaborator. Ronald Jackson, journalist for The Smooth Jazz Ride, states "Artists like Kim Scott bring an exuberance to an art form long prophesied to be a thing of the past in short order by critics. When you listen to the Pied Piper-like allure and magic of her style, you come to the conclusion that those critics couldn't be farther from the truth." Her collaborations include performances and recordings with Jonathan Fritzen, James Lloyd, Greg Manning, Jazmin Ghent and others.

Kim Scott received a Bachelor of Music in Performance from University of Alabama at Tuscaloosa (Sheryl Cohen) and a Master of Music in Pedagogy and Performance from Oklahoma State University (Jonathan Keeble). As a National Board-Certified Teacher, Kim Scott, also known as Kim Strickland in the classical world, is the flute professor at the Alabama School of Fine Arts where she was formerly Chair of the Department of Music for 14 years before becoming Director of Student Support Services in 2019. An active teacher and clinician, Kim Scott has given clinics and masterclasses at Mid-South, International Festival of Flutists in South America, Bama Flute Fest, and Iowa Flute Fest conventions, to name a few, and has been selected to present concerts for various national conventions such as the National Flute Association. Kim is on the Board of Directors for the National Flute Association and the coordinator for NFA's Jazz Flute Masterclass Competition. A versatile player, Kim is not only well-known as one of the top flutists in the country, but she is also known for her role as a member of the all-female jazz supergroup, Jazz in Pink, and the Symphony Orchestra. Flutist Mimi Stillman is an internationally acclaimed solo, chamber, and recording artist hailed by the New York Times as "not only a consummate and charismatic performer, but also a scholar. Her programs tend to activate ear, heart, and brain." Praised for her "exquisite purity of sound and depth of emotion" (Diario de Yucatán), she has appeared as a soloist with major orchestras and as recitalist and chamber musician at prestigious venues throughout the United States and internationally. Renowned for her virtuosity, insightful interpretation, and adventurous programming, she has appeared as soloist with orchestras including the Philadelphia Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of the Triangle, Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia, Bach Collegium Stuttgart, and Orquesta Sinfónica de Yucatán; and at venues including Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, Philadelphia Chamber Music Society, Smithsonian American Art Museum, Symphony Space, Philadelphia Museum of Art, National Sawdust, Roulette, Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, La Jolla Music Society, Verbier Festival (Switzerland), Kol HaMusica (Israel), on Curtis On Tour's virtual Latin American tour 2021 in Mexico, Chile, Colombia, and Peru.



Mimi Stillman is the founding Artistic Director of the popular Dolce Suono Ensemble (DSE), performing Baroque to new music in Philadelphia and on tour, in programs with high intellectual content setting music in its broadest cultural context. Some of DSE's outstanding projects include Mahler 100 / Schoenberg 60; Women of American Music; and A Place Pioneers and a Name: Remembering the Holocaust. "All programs should have this much to say, and say it so well." (The Philadelphia Inquirer). A Spanish speaker, Ms. Stillman created DSE's award-winning Música en tus Manos (Music in Your Hands) project to engage Philadelphia's Latino communities in the chamber and popular music of Latin America. DSE has been awarded grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, William Penn Foundation, Aaron Copland Fund for Music, and other prestigious institutions, and enjoys a partnership with the Washington National Opera at the invitation of Plácido Domingo.

Stillman's artistic diversity makes a unique mark on the music world winning the Bärenreiter Prize for Best Historical Performance, engaging Latino communities through her Música en tus Manos project, and reaching a global audience as masterclass teacher and Livestream and media host. She is the host of "Tea with Mimi," her Livestream series initiated early in the Covid pandemic. A leader in the new music field contributing important new works to the repertoire for her instrument, Stillman has given 60 world premieres in 17 seasons with Dolce Suono Ensemble.

Mimi Stillman has won numerous competitions and awards including Young Concert Artists International Auditions, Astral Artists Auditions, and the Philadelphia Women in the Arts Award. A Yamaha Performing Artist and Clinician, she has taught masterclasses and done residencies for universities throughout the United States and internationally, including Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM), École normale de Musique de Paris, Teatro Municipal de Santiago (Chile), and conservatories in Milan, Puerto Rico, Buenos Aires, and Bogotá. She is on faculty at Temple University and Music for All National Festival.

Mimi Stillman made the leap from child prodigy to inimitable artist. At age 12, she was the youngest wind player ever admitted to the Curtis Institute of Music, where she studied with the legendary Julius Baker and Jeffrey Khaner and earned her Bachelor of Music degree. She holds an MA in History from the University of Pennsylvania, and has written on music and history for publications including the Oxford Encyclopedia of the Modern World and the Journal of the Mozart Society of America. www.mimistillman.com www.dolcesuono.com





Marianne Gedigian, Professor of Flute, holder of the Butler Professorship in Music and a member of the Academy of Distinguished Teachers at The University of Texas at Austin, was a regular performer with the Boston Symphony Orchestra for over a decade, including many seasons as Acting Principal Flute under Seiji Ozawa.

As Principal Flute with the Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra and Acting Principal Flute with the Boston Pops, Ms. Gedigian has been heard on dozens of recordings and Evening at Pops television broadcasts as well as the nationally broadcast Fourth of July specials on public television. She has also been heard on several John Williams' movie scores, including Saving Private Ryan and Schindler's List. In the 2000 - 2001 season, Ms. Gedigian was invited by Mariss Jansons to perform as Acting Principal Flute with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra.

Her solo performances have taken her around the world, including recitals in Japan, Australia, England, and Armenia, and she has appeared as concerto soloist numerous times with the Boston Pops Orchestra and with the Armenian Philharmonic performing her own transcription of the Khachaturian Violin Concerto. She was featured with Ian Anderson of Jethro Tull fame in a performance at the Berklee College of Music in Boston. Ms. Gedigian has been a headliner soloist and teacher at numerous National Flute Association conventions across the country, and is a frequent recitalist and teacher across the globe.



Gedigian was first prize winner in the National Ms. Flute Young Artist Competition, the Association's and James Pappoutsakis Memorial Flute Competition. She is a founding member of Boston-based chamber music ensemble Walden Chamber Players and was formerly a member of the Dorian Wind Quintet, one of chamber music's preeminent and longest continuously-active ensembles. Ms. Gedigian's solo recordings include Voice of the Flute and Revolution, both with pianist Rick Rowley, and she is featured on a recording of flute, strings, and piano with the Walden Chamber Players titled Finding a Voice: The Evolution of the American Sound. She is the featured soloist on the Naxos Grammy-nominated CD, Shadow of Sirius.

Ms. Gedigian has served on the faculties of Boston University's College of Fine Arts, The Boston Conservatory, the Round Top International Institute, and the Tanglewood Music Center and the Brevard Music Center. Her teachers include Leone Buyse, Doriot Anthony Dwyer, Clement Barone, and Donna Olkowski. Ms. Gedigian is a William S. Haynes Artist and performs on a handmade custom-crafted Haynes gold flute.





Gabriel Sánchez is on the keyboard staff of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra under Fabio Luisi and has collaborated with principal DSO musicians, including Concertmasters, Alexander Kerr and Nathan Olson.

Sánchez was a top prize winner in the 1997 Casablanca International Piano Competition in Morocco and is a laureate of other international competitions, including the Marguerite Long in Paris (France), the Gina Bachauer in Salt Lake City (USA), and the Paloma O' Shea in Santander (Spain). He has performed throughout the United States and internationally in recital and as soloist with orchestra, including performances at Pianofest in the Hamptons, New York, with the Dallas Symphony under Kerry-Lynn Wilson and the Orquesta Filarmonica de Jalisco and the Irving Symphony under Hector Guzman.

Robert Carlos Contreras Roman, Mexican music critic, wrote that Sanchez performed with "gran passion y expresividad estilistica." In London, he performed at the Royal Academy of Music, in Paris at the Salle Gaveau, in Santander, Spain at the Palacio de Festivales, in Casablanca, Morocco at the Salle de l'Office des Changes, and in the Dominican Republic with the Orquesta Sinfonica Nacional. In Thessaloniki, Greece, he performed a solo recital to benefit Lions Club International.



He studied at London's Royal Academy of Music under a full scholarship and continued his studies at the University of North Texas under his beloved teacher and mentor, Vladimir Viardo, 1973 Van Cliburn Gold Medalist.

Sánchez is in high demand as a collaborative pianist and has partnered in recitals with Stanislav Katenin (principal bassoon, National Philharmonic of Russia), Gordon Hunt (principal oboe, Philharmonia Orchestra, London), Jacques Zoon (former Principal Flute, Concertgebouw Orchestra, Amsterdam), Mark Nuccio (Associate Principal Clarinet, New York Philharmonic) and Paul Edmund Davies (former Principal Flute, London Symphony Orchestra), as well as world renowned artists Gary Schocker, Alexa Still, Marco Granados, Thomas Robertello, Rolf Smedvig, Ian Clarke, Mike Mower and Jean Ferrandis.

Mr. Sánchez is also a dedicated educator. He taught piano, music history, music theory and accompanying at the celebrated Booker T. Washington High School for the Arts in Dallas from <u>1996-2003</u>. He maintains a select private piano studio and has been involved with DSO educational outreach programs. He has also served on the faculty of the Conservatory of Music in the Mountains in Durango, Colorado.

He is currently Collaborative Artist in Piano and Adjunct Professor of Piano at the University of Texas at Arlington.

Iranian flutist, **Mehrdad Gholami**, the first-place winner of Iran's National Concours, received presidential award and Iran's National Elites Foundation scholarship to continue his training at the University of Tehran, where he studied with Dr. Azin Movahed. 
